### **Explanatory notes**

When reading these tables, please note that:

- 1. Years relate to academic years. Unless otherwise stated, figures relate to all students paying higher fees, not just entrants.
- 2. All income and expenditure data is based on estimates provided by institutions and built on assumptions around student numbers and the make-up of the student cohort, which may change over time. Figures do not include inflation.
- 3. We have published updated sector and institutional level data for 2012-13 access agreements in OFFA publication 2012/06, available at www.offa.org.uk/publications. This has been updated to include initial teacher training courses for the first time. However, readers should take particular care when comparing 2012-13 access agreement data with 2013-14 access agreement data. This is because the 2012-13 data was submitted to us between April 2011 and February 2012 and in many cases does not reflect institutional changes to student number controls as a result of AAB+/ABB+, core and margin, and latest student number projections. In addition it only covers full-time courses.
- 4. The expenditure on fee waivers, bursaries and scholarships is only the amount spent on lower income students or other underrepresented groups. Lower income is defined as any student with an assessed household income of up to £42,611. This is the upper government threshold for partial state maintenance grants for entrants in 2013-14.
- 5. The government has allocated £50m to the National Scholarship Programme in 2012-13, rising to £100m in 2013-14 and £150m in 2014-15. There have been no announcements about funding beyond 2014-15; however, for the purposes of our modelling, we have assumed that funding continues at 2014-15 levels in 2015-16 and 2016-17. A small proportion of NSP funding has been allocated to institutions without access agreements.
- 6. The expenditure on financial support, outreach and retention is not the total amount spent by institutions in these areas. It is the additional amount that institutions have committed following the introduction of variable fees.
- 7. Data excludes courses funded by the Department of Health.

### Notes:

- 1. 'Fee income' is all fee income above the basic fee for Home/European Union undergraduates. For old system students, the basic fee in 2013-14 is £1,380 and the maximum fee for institutions with access agreements is £3,465. For new system students, the basic fee is £6,000 and the maximum fee for institutions with access agreements in £9,000. For part-time new system students, the basic fee is £4,500 and the maximum fee is £6,750.
- 2. Most institutions have three- or four-year courses, so we have assumed that 2016-17 represents a steady state for institutional arrangements introduced from 2013-14.
- 3. The number of FECs with access agreements has reduced from <math>66 in 2011-12 to 25 in 2012-13, and 28 in 2013-14.

- 5. As set out in our guidance on how to produce access agreements (OFFA publication 2012/03, How to produce an access agreement for 2013-14, paragraph 65), we considered institutions' access performance against the range of HESA's performance indicators in T1a, and the proportion of lower income students they already attract, as a starting point for understanding their agreement.

- 7. 'Institutional financial support' includes fee waivers, bursaries, scholarships and other in-kind support offered under access agreements and the National Scholarship Programme. 'Average fees after fee waivers/institutional financial support' only includes awards to students from OFFA-countable groups; many institutions also offer other awards but these are not included here.
- 8. The figures shown assume a flat fee of £6,000 for FECs without access agreements. BIS data indicates that there are around 11,000 and 18,000 full-time students at FECs without access agreements in 2012-13 and 2013-14 respectively.
- 9. The government's National Scholarship Programme (NSP) allocation contributes £96.0m in 2013-14 and £137.7m in 2016-17. This figure is less than the full government NSP funding of £100m/£150m, as some NSP funding has been allocated to institutions without access agreements (i.e. those charging fees below the basic level of £6,000 (full-time) and/or £4,500 (part-time)).
